





## "It's About Mission"

In November of 2004, I was elected to serve as a member of the Board of Directors of *The Servant's Heart* (TSH), a recognized service organization of The Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod (LCMS). Our January board meeting took place "on site" in Guatemala City, Guatemala. You see, the primary mission field for TSH is the city dump of Guatemala City. There TSH serves "the poorest of the poor," the people who live in and around the dump, by providing clean food and water five days a week, as well as health care, Christian education and childcare, spiritual and economic development, and volunteer ministry opportunities for concerned Christians. At that time, the wheels were already in motion for TSH to expand its mission and ministry to the people living in and around East Chicago, Indiana. The mission of TSH is just one aspect of the larger mission and ministry of the LCMS to all the peoples of the world, centered in the proclamation of the Good News of eternal salvation in Jesus Christ.

January has traditionally been designated "Mission Month" in the LCMS since the season of Epiphany begins on January 6<sup>th</sup>, The Epiphany of Our Lord. The word "epiphany' comes from the Greek verb meaning "to make known, reveal, show." In the worship services at Messiah Lutheran Church during the Epiphany season, Jesus, the true son of Mary, is also revealed as the true Son of God,



#### From the Board of Elders

In the December newsletter, my article focused on the fact that there was no Head Elder elected at the voter's meeting in November. In addition, at the time of my writing, I was only aware of two of the current Elders who had indicated their willingness to serve for another year if asked. These two facts were the catalysts that caused the Board of Elders to suggest that the ushers take on the duties associated with church services. That being said, I am very pleased to report that none of the changes envisioned will take place at this time as Maurice Doublett has volunteered to take on the role of Head Elder and that four of the current Elders are willing to serve another year. That is truly great news.

At our Elders meeting in December, it was agreed that the Elders should continue to perform their current duties and there was no need to transfer any duties to the ushers. On the matter of alleviating the collection from the service, a collection box has been ordered, but the collection process will remain the same at this time as well.

If anyone is questioning how Maurice is stepping into the role of Head Elder, he is being appointed for the one-year period of January 15, 2024 to January 15, 2025. His appointment is per Article VI (A.)3(c) of the church By-Laws. If he wants to continue in that role at the end of the coming year, he will have to be nominated by the nomination committee and be elected by the voters at the voter's meeting in November 2024. He can then be elected to serve a full two-year term as per the By-Laws.

### Update from the Call Committee

Because this update is being written before Christmas, in order to give Maurine a well deserved rest with some time off between Christmas and New Years, it contains a few assumptions of what will have happened by the time you are reading this. As was stated in the Update issued in the Friday newsletter on December 7th, the Call Committee has held Zoom meetings with a number of pastors and narrowed its search down to a small number of candidates that the committee believes can fill the needs of Messiah. These pastors were contacted concerning furthering our discussions with them about a call by setting up second meetings by Zoom or by their coming to visit Messiah/Boerne in person. In that newsletter it was stated that the committee was going to allow the pastors to get through the Advent/Christmas season and those arrangements would be made in the first week of January. Since the first week of January is still ten days away, the exact arrangements have not yet been made, but by the time you are reading this, they will have been.

I know that many in the congregation are anxious to know who the committee is considering and we should be able to reveal that information soon. The committee will act in accordance with Article III, B. of the church By-Laws, where it states, "The "Call List" candidate(s) recommended by the Call Committee shall be announced both orally and in writing to the Congregation on two (2) consecutive Sundays before the Call Meeting." As soon as the committee has confirmed with the pastors being considered that their names can be released, they will be provided to the Congregation. Our waiting for permission from the pastors, centers on giving them the opportunity to notify their current congregations that they are being considered for a call and eliminate the chance that one of their members could find out they are being considered before they are informed by the pastor himself.

It is hope of the Call Committee that we will be ready to make our recommendation to the Congregation in the second half of January and have the "Call Meeting" toward the end of January. Again, the congregation will be given the pastors' names and the names of the churches they are currently serving at least two weeks prior to the "Call Meeting". Because each of the pastors being considered serve churches that stream their Sunday services, if a member so desires, they will be able to see the candidates performing Sunday services in their own churches. Other information concerning each of the candidates will be provided when their names are announced.

It is the hope of the Call Committee that a Call will be issued by the end of January and accepted in early February. Once our Call is accepted, it will depend on the pastor as to when he would arrive at Messiah. Please keep this entire process and all involved in your prayers.


#### Meeting your Board of Directors


