In the last days of August, the Refurbishment team completed a walk through to mark punch list items for touch up as the project is nearing completion. The Joeris project manager submitted updates to the architect, and we received the Certificate of Substantial Completion from the architect on Aug 31st. The forms for the final safety review by the Fire Marshall were submitted and we are awaiting review and approval to occupy the facility.

Hopefully, prayerfully, by the time you read this the final clean up, approval for occupancy and move -in will have occurred, boxes unpacked, computers hooked up and church operations up and running. Then a date set for our first Worship Sunday will be announced. Barring any complications, we anticipate being in the church by mid-September and a Rededication celebration scheduled for Oct 8th.

What started almost two years ago as a "freshening up" with a little paint and replacing a stained carpet has blossomed into a complete renovation. Through many ups and downs during the project we are almost there thanks to the very generous contributions and efforts of many.

God Labors through Us

The following article was written by Pastor Lofgren for the September 2, 2005 edition of The Herald-Press, Huntington, Indiana.

Soon the season of summer will be over, and for me, one of the surest signs of the end of summer is Labor Day. When I was growing up, after Labor Day, the pools closed, the schools opened, and everyone got back to their "regular" schedules. Even with schools opening in mid-August now, Labor Day continues to mark the end of summer for many and the beginning of another year of "labor."

With Labor Day being celebrated this weekend, an article recognizing God's gift of vocation seems appropriate. For many people, the term "vocation" is considered religious, as in a "religious vocation," such as a priest, a pastor, or a nun. For people of my own religious tradition, the Lutheran tradition, the word "vocation" is understood as properly applying to any type of labor. The factory worker and the teacher, the mayor and the maid all have been gifted and called by God to serve in their respective roles or stations in society. God has called each of us into our unique places in society, and through us God provides blessings to other people in society. Thus, we each serve others in the positions we hold in society in God's place, or rather, God's serves others through us. God labors through us. We are, so-to-speak, God's masks, God being hidden behind us as he serves others through us.

When we recognize that God works through us to bless others in society, all roles and positions in society are endowed with divine honor. God not only calls the "religious" into their offices to serve others for their spiritual welfare, but also the factory worker to provide the goods that serve to benefit others. The doctor is called to serve for the physical benefit of others, and the teacher for their intellectual benefit. The counselor serves others for their emotional welfare, and the mayor serves the whole community for the general welfare of all. Even the maid who sweeps and cooks and cleans is called by God to serve for the benefit of the people of the house where she works.

When you reflect upon Luther's doctrine of vocation, you may also recognize that each of us is called into various vocations in life. For example, a man might serve as a farmer, a husband, a father, and an officer in his local congregation all at the same time. Likewise, a woman might serve as a homemaker, a wife, a mother, a nurse, and a Sunday School teacher. Through each of these various roles in society, as well as countless others, God serves the human family, providing for the physical, emotional, mental and spiritual needs of people. As they say, "God does not need our good works, but our neighbor does."

As we celebrate Labor Day this coming Monday, let us give thanks to God for the strength and ability He gives us to fulfill our various vocations in life. Let us also thank God for all other workers in the world, for through their labor God blesses us with his good gifts.

Becoming a Welcoming

There is a great little book with a quick read that brings many simple points about being a Welcoming church. Below is an excerpt.

The Path to Becoming a Welcoming Church - Excerpt from Becoming a Welcoming Church by Thom S. Rainer. *QUESTION:* Would you return to a place where you did not feel welcome?

What takes place in the first 10 minutes when a first-time guest arrives at your church will largely determine whether he or she returns. First Step: you must understand and believe in the importance of becoming a welcoming church.

When non-Christians feel welcomed, they return. When they return, they have more opportunities to hear the gospel preached and to develop relationships with believers. And those relationships are often used of God to bring people to His Son.

While we should definitely be reaching out beyond the walls of our church facilities, imagine what a difference it would make if we were just as effective welcoming those who showed up.

We need welcoming members who respond positively to the admonition of Paul in Philippians 2:3:" Do nothing out of selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility consider others more important than yourselves."

I pray all our members would be on the lookout for those they don't know, and not be shy about introducing themselves with a friendly smile . . . even it is a member you don't know with a name tag! Even more so, taking time to welcome and introduce yourself to those who are visitors. After service or Bible Study take the time to interact, find out a little about them. We should always invite visitors to return again and would you even consider inviting someone to coffee or lunch!

The online Pastoral Profile Survey closed on Monday afternoon and our District representative, Larry Rietz, should provide the compiled results of the survey to the Call Committee by Thursday or Friday of this week. Larry is going to meet with the Call Committee on Tuesday, Sept. 5th to go over the results of the survey. On Wednesday or Thursday, the 5th or 6th of September, the results of the survey will be emailed to the congregation and hard copies will be made available on Sunday the 10th. As we have done throughout this process, we will then have a Town Hall meeting to go over the results as a church

body. This meeting will be held on September 17th after the 10:30 am church service. Once that meeting has been held, the Call Committee will provide one more opportunity for members to provide the name of a pastor they know who might be in alignment with the results of the survey. That period will probably last just three or four days, as once that period closes, the Call Committee is ready to submit Messiah's call package. I encourage you to make every effort to attend that meeting, as the results of the survey are going to be the predominant guide that District will use to try to match Messiah with candidates that have the attributes that we say we want. Please keep praying for Messiah and the entire call process.






Bill Loren




NET ASSET BALANCES 12/31/2022 VS 6/30/2023



Adult Education - September 2023

Congratulations to all the learning teams for accomplishing their purpose of making Messiah a more sustainable Church body. Now we have a vision and a mission we can all support. How can our lay ministries support this vision and mission?

In Matthew 28, right after Jesus resurrection, "18 And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Our vision and mission are in alignment with what Jesus said. We are to go, and make more disciples, from all nations (all neighborhoods, our town, our county, and state plus other nations). We are to make disciples by sharing the law and Gospel, by baptizing them and by teaching them all that Jesus commanded.

Two of our lay ministries are called Discipleship and Adult Education. These and others are called to support and help implement this mission, this outreach to others. I suggest there are three aspects to "making disciples":

- 1. We first must "go and make new disciples" through evangelism to those outside our existing membership. This is a challenge for us, and we need to face it.
- 2. The second step is the one we all love: discipleship of "teaching them". Once a person comes to Jesus, there's a

whole host of baggage that needs to be unpacked from their life. There's the sin nature to wrestle with, addictions to break, mindsets to change. Transformation needs to happen through catechesis, community and growth in Bible knowledge so new disciples grow in their faith through the Holy Spirit. But if that's where we stop, we haven't yet made devoted disciples of Jesus.

That's where so many churches stop, on a never-ending treadmill of more and more Bible knowledge (which is great) and more and more fellowship with other believers (which is needed). But a fully-devoted disciple is not simply the Christian with the most Bible knowledge. In Jesus' day, the people with the greatest Bible knowledge were the Pharisees. Do we ever behave like Pharisees?

3. The last step in creating devoted disciples circles all the way back around to evangelism. The mark of a disciple is one who is making other disciples, a disciple who is bringing others to the faith either through personal evangelism or bringing others with them to church to introduce them to Jesus.

Let us "teach all things" and with the Holy Spirit create disciples who are making other disciples. Evangelism is the greatest form of discipleship. This should be our focus going forward.

You might have heard Brad and Laura Sanders give this presentation in January 2020 at Messiah; however, they have updated it to show how Artificial Intelligence is changing the world and exposing you to more fraud. Victims range from all ages and professional backgrounds, so no one is immune to being targeted.

Therefore, this presentation is geared toward all ages, as evidenced by the number of victims and total dollars lost in 2022. Last year, the largest age category of victims was those in their 30's, with 94,506 reported. The age bracket that lost the most money was those older than 60, with \$3.1 Billion reported in 2022. 27 Years of Braille Workshops

On a Wednesday in January of 1996 the first Braille Team from Messiah traveled into San Antonio to learn the necessary skills to assist in the production of Braille Books of the Bible.

"Lutheran Braille Workers exists to bring the Word of God to the 338 million people throughout the world who are Blind or Visually Impaired, completely free of charge in Braille and Specialized Large Print.

Men, Women and children find hope in the Light of Christ through the Bible and other Christian materials provided by LBW in multiple languages in every part of the globe. LBW is one of the last remaining free resources available to them in which the Good News of Jesus is shared quickly and in high quality formats.

In over 80 years of ministry, Lutheran Braille Workers has produced and distributed over 15 million volumes of Christian material, in 40 languages, to people in 164 countries. LBW has never charged a recipient to receive these materials as we believe in freely sharing God's Word!" (taken from LBWINC.org website)

27 years later there is still a group from Messiah Lutheran Church that travel to Mt. Calvary Lutheran Church in San Antonio on the first Wednesday of each month.


