Lent - What's love got to do with it?

Americans often associate the month of February with "*love*" since many people in our society celebrate Valentine's Day on the 14th. On this special day, people will exchange cards, candy, flowers, and other gifts as expressions of love to each other. This year the church also begins the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on February 14th. During Lent we remember our Savior's great love for us and all people as demonstrated by his suffering

and sacrificial death on the cross for our salvation. Since our celebrations of Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday are so different, yet each do with *"love"* let's review what the Bible says about love.

Various words used in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are translated by the English word "*love*." Three of these words in Greek are of particular importance: eros, philos, and agape. First, eros denotes the love between a man and a woman that includes feelings of longing, craving, and desire. In Greek mythology, Eros was the god of love, and his Roman counterpart, Cupid, is associated in our culture with Valentine's Day - you know, the little guy with wings and a bow and arrow! Eros is associated with romantic love and describes, among other relationships, the married love of a husband and wife.

The second word, philos, is the most general word for love and human affection. It mainly denotes the attraction of people who are close to each other both inside and outside the family. It includes concern, care, and hospitality, as well as love for things in the sense of "being fond of." Thus we have philosophy, "the love of knowledge," philadelphia, "love for a friend or brother," and the name Philip, "lover of horses."

The third word is agape. In nearly every case in which agape is used in the New Testament, it speaks of God's relationship with human beings. It is divine love and refers either to God's love for people, people's love of God, or the love for other people which God's love evokes in a person. We are most familiar with the use of agape in "the Gospel in a nutshell" (*"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son. . . ." John 3:16*) and "the Golden rule" (*"You shall love your neighbor as yourself"* Matt 19:19). Agape, the origin of which is in God alone, is the fulfillment of the law (*"Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for whoever loves others has fulfilled the law."* Rom 13:8).

Which brings us to Ash Wednesday and our celebration of Lent. This year our congregation will follow a sermon series entitled The Crosses of Lent. Out of God's great agape for you and for me and for all people, He sent his only Son, Jesus Christ, to suffer and die upon the cross of Calvary for our salvation. Our Lenten series will explore the themes suggested by nine classic depictions of the cross. The history of each of The Cross of Lent - of prophecy, humility, hope, regeneration, suffering, mission, redemption, passion, and victory - points us to an aspect of the rich meaning of the cross of Jesus. As we join together in devotion and meditation on the cross in all its aspects, we will find, with the hymn writer, *"Sweet moments rich in blessing, Which before the CROSS we spend."*

Invitation and Challenge . . . Read, study, discuss the Bible

"Finally, we have cause to celebrate our synodical jubilee with fear and trembling when we glance at the present condition of our Synod. It is true, we still have the very precious treasure, the pure Word of God. As a rule, it still governs our congregations, but it cannot be denied that we are no longer what our fathers were. Indeed, the symptoms of the decline are evident and increasing among us. I will only point out a few. The holy zeal to study and grow in God's Word has declined markedly among both preachers and hearers. The boundary between us and the world is no longer drawn so sharply. Our manner of life is not always prudent. Terrible scandals, also on the part of our pastors, are on the increase. While we are richer in earthly things than our fathers, we are weaker in faith and Christian love." Friedrich Pfotenhauer, 1897

Friedrich Pfotenhauer was president of the LCMS from 1911 to 1935. He said the above to the gathered district pastors and laypeople in 1897 on the 50th anniversary of the Synod when he was president of the Minnesota and Dakota District. Wow! If Pfotenhauer felt that way about his generation, I dare say his words are an indictment exponentially greater upon ours. We spend plenty of time lamenting the state of the world, but we have a much more difficult time recognizing the encroachment of the world's viewpoints upon us.

Jesus preached, "Back to the Bible!" "You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness about me" (John 5:39). The apostles preached, "Back to the Bible!" In fact, every great era of reform in the Church's life has begun with the cry to repentance, and "Back to the Bible!"

The Lutheran Reformation was exactly such an event. The Lutheran Confessional Revival of the 19th century was also such an event. After a century of pastors and scholars denying that the Scriptures are the Word of God - and even that Christ is the God-Man, "*the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world*" (John 1:29) - a revival of serious study of the Word of God began in the 1820s. Soon many were captivated by the truth of Scripture.

The Scriptures are God's own inspired and infallible Word. "Holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit" (2 Peter 1:21). Jesus Himself quoted the Old Testament as the very Word of God and as absolutely reliable and authoritative ("the mouth of God" Matt. 4:4; "It is written," Matt. 21:13; Mark 11:17; Luke 19:46; "this which is written must be fulfilled in me," Luke 22:37; "Have you not read that which was spoken unto you by God ..." Matt. 22:31–32; and much more!).

- Can we be sure of Christ, forgiveness and eternal life? Back to the Bible! (1 John 4:1-4)
- How shall we treat each other in the Church? Back to the Bible! (1 Corinthians 13)
- Shall we share the Word of the Gospel with others? Back to the Bible! (Luke 19:10)
- How shall we hold up under suffering and ill health? Back to the Bible! (Romans 5; Hebrews 12; 1 Peter 1)

There is no problem of faith, life, family or Church for which the Bible does not have answers.

#### Invitation and challenge!

As Messiah awaits the Pastor, God calls for us, what a great time it is for us to strengthen and revive our faith by gathering in small groups to read, study and discuss the Bible. There are several opportunities available to us; Pastor's continued pre-service discussion using, "Begin," Adult Bible discussions (being scheduled) and opportunity for small groups of friends and neighbors to organize and gather to discuss the Bible and build relationships.

### From the Call Committee

If you missed the voter's meeting on the 28th the congregation voted unanimously to issue a call for the position of Sole Pastor to Pastor Stephen DeMik. Pastor DeMik was notified of the vote and he did indicate that he was still in a position to consider a call to Messiah. The call documents were sent to Pastor DeMik at his request on Sunday evening as he was leaving for San Diego early Monday morning for a weeklong training session in San Diego. He said he and his wife, who was accompanying him, would be able to discuss and digest the information during their free time over the course of the week.

As you recall, Pastor DeMik was already considering a call to Hope Lutheran in Lubbock. I can only assume that he will make a decision as to take or decline that call during the course of this week, as I had been told that he needed to let Hope know by the end of January, which was Wednesday of this week. I don't think we will hear from Pastor DeMik until he returns from San Diego. At that time, he will have either accepted the call to Hope or he will have declined and be still considering the call to Messiah.

If he declines the call to Hope and wants to pursue the call to Messiah, I think he will call us and try to set up a time to come visit the church and the Boerne area. I think we would try to set up something for the following week, depending on his work schedule and the days he has off. If he does come to visit, once that occurs, I don't think we will hear an answer for another week, perhaps two.

That being the case, if he does decline Hope and considers our call, I don't think we'll know his decision before mid to late February. We must be patient. Pastors do not rush into these decisions. The call committee will keep you informed as we are informed. I want to remind everyone that although some people in Pastor DeMik's church are aware of both of these calls, the parishioners may not be. Consequently, please **DO NOT POST** any comments about the call to **ANY** social media platform.

Please keep Pastor DeMik in your prayers as he contemplates how he may best serve the Lord (which could be by staying in his current call). *Your brother in Christ, Mike Lang*




