## Where (and how) are We Going?

## A story by Lloyd Ogilvie from "Time with God."

One day while I was sailing, the wind went down and the sea became calm and flat. There was nothing to do but sit in irons and wait for the wind. "Irons" is a sailing term for a windless time of drifting. While waiting for the wind, I drifted past another sailboat that was floating aimlessly. The people on board the craft waved and made a flat of the hand gesture of complaint about then lack of wind. One man stood by the sails and blew on them. I thought about that for a long time afterward. How like many Christians and far too many churches, human breath blowing on the sails no wonder we make so little progress!

The Spirit of God in Hebrew is "ruach," meaning "breath" and "wind." At Pentecost the power of the Holy Spirit was like a mighty wind. The Spirit filled the disciples and got them moving again. What we need is a mighty wind - a fresh, bracing wind of a new Pentecost.
... So stop blowing your own breath into the sails of your life or your church. Ask for a fresh wind to fill the sails. Without the Holy Spirit, we'll drift in irons and be lost at sea ...

## A prayer of Clement of Rome

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, grant, we pray, that we might be grounded and settled in your truth by the coming of your Holy Spirit into our hearts. What we do not know, reveal to us; What is lacking within us, make complete; That which we do know, confirm in us;
And keep us blameless in your service, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
As we welcome 2023 let us continue, in Prayer, to ask for guidance from the Holy Spirit to give us clear direction in the path He would have Messiah take. In our community, guide us to share His Gospel and to serve others to fulfill our assignment to "Go and Make Disciples."



In the Book of Psalms we read, "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" (11:3 ESV). Over the last thirty to forty years, some foundational changes have taken place in American society and have impacted the Christian church. Due to these cultural changes in our society, some of the educational and evangelism programs used and promoted by our church may no longer be as effective in making disciples as they were in the past. Since an ever increasing proportion of our society does not have a basic understanding of the teachings of the Bible, the Adult Bible Class has been studying a book from Answers in Genesis entitled Begin, a book which includes foundational portions of the Bible from Genesis, Exodus, John, Romans, and Revelation. Beginning on Sunday, January 9, 2023, we will take a break from studying the Gospel of John and begin a study of the Lutheran Christian faith leading to Adult Confirmation for those who desire it. By the way, this is also an excellent opportunity to review your Lutheran Christian beliefs.

In his letter to the Church in Sardis, St. John provides a plan in order to deal with the current condition of our crumbling biblical culture:

> Wake up, and strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have not found your works complete in the sight of my God. Remember, then, what you have received and heard. Keep it, and repent. If you will not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what hour I will come against you. (Rev. 3:2-3 ESV)

Like the Church in Sardis, the members of Messiah Lutheran Church have received a good biblical foundation for the Christian faith from the preaching and teaching ministry of our church, but without regular attendance of worship services and Bible classes, this foundation will be destroyed. Just as regular eating of food and exercising of our bodies is necessary for physical health, so also regular worship and Bible study is necessary for our spiritual health. As a Christian congregation, we need to wake up from our spiritual slumber and repent of our apathetic attitude toward hearing and learning the Word of God. Then we can "strengthen what remains" through regular worship and study of God's Word in Sunday school and Bible Study classes.

Of course, the God-pleasing solution to our present situation is not only to reinforce our understanding of God's word by coming to church, but also to reach out to the people we know, as well as to establish new relationships with people we don't know, with the Good News about Jesus. As Jesus told His disciples before His ascension, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt 28:19-20a). Like God's people in all ages, the Early Church had her difficulties, but she understood the times she lived in. We also need to understand the times and challenges we face and respond appropriately. By participating in Adult Bible Class, working through Begin with the rest of the Adult Bible class, and studying Lutheran Christian teaching from the Bible, you will be equipped to bear witness to others about the new life that awaits them through Jesus Christ, who is the Door (Jn 10:9).

## Adult Education

The New Year provides us a new opportunity to grow as Christians in God's Word with lessons from Scripture on how we should live our lives and how we can carry out the Great Commission.

Our first priority is to worship together according to Scripture as we believe,
 teach and confess in our Lutheran Book of Concord. This worship is led by our Pastor, who teaches us weekly sharing the Word and practicing the Sacraments of Holy Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

To get into more depth of understanding Pastor also teaches a weekly Bible study where we learn and discuss details on Bible books and topics. We have just completed going through the first eleven chapters of Genesis, creation, the flood and populating the earth after the Tower of Babel. We also studied Exodus 20, the Ten Commandments. This year he will teach us from other essential books of the Bible and, as always, we offer classes for people about the basics of Christianity and those interested in joining Messiah.

Growing as Christians, becoming true followers of Christ, is the subject of Discipleship. Growing out as Christians we learn to share the Gospel message with our neighbors. This is evangelism, and our district now has a special course, Evangelism 101, for building evangelism practice. Explaining the reason for our faith and defending the Christian Worldview is also important as we seek through love to lead others to the correct path. The latter is the subject of Apologetics, meaning to defend.

This year there will be opportunities in small groups in homes and in classes at Messiah to explore each of these topics. Each will be Bible based. Tentative studies include looking at the Lutheran difference versus other denominations (see the November LW). Another study looks at Christianity versus other world religious beliefs (note the current Avatar movies). Yet another gets into Discipleship 101 and one into evangelism.

The first classes begin the second week of January. Watch for announcements of subjects and dates. Also, this year we will encourage personal, at home daily Bible study. We realize you may have your own way to do this. Messiah provides Portals of Prayer to support you.

In addition, we are encouraging a specific plan to read through the entire Bible in 2023. This plan uses Laura Sanders new book, Your Companion to the \#1 Bestseller - Making Sense of it to Transform Your Life. It uses a chronological daily listing of Scriptures that includes Old Testament reading for five days followed by two days in the New Testament. Laura's book includes thought provoking questions and encouragements for each day. We will have periodic discussion groups including an online setup using Microsoft Teams. Let us have your email if you are interested in joining this group.
