<u>" Take a Stand "</u>

November is a month for thanksgiving. We thank God for the innumerable blessings he has given and continues to give us in this earthly life. One of the greatest blessings he gives us is good government, and this year on Tuesday, November 7th, 2023, we have the opportunity to take a stand and vote for candidates and on issues that will affect us in the coming years. The article that follows was written for the Herald-Press, Huntington, Indiana. God bless your reading ... and your voting!

On October 31st, 1517, a man took a stand. His name was Martin Luther, and he took a stand regarding his Christian beliefs by nailing ninety-five theses for public debate on the door of the castle church in Wittenberg, Germany. These theses began a world-wide movement in the Christian church known as the Reformation and resulted in major changes in the church and in society in general. Nearly four years later Luther would take a stand again concerning his religious beliefs before Charles V, the emperor of the Holy Roman Empire. In Worms, Germany, he confessed that what he had written concerning the Christian faith was correct, and that, unless persuaded from the Holy Scriptures and by sound reason that what he had written was incorrect, he would not recant, that is, take it back.

Instead, Luther took a stand. Here is a translation of what he said:

"My conscience is bound by the Word of God. I cannot and I will not recant, for it is unsafe for a Christian to speak against his conscience. Here I stand, I can do no other; may God help me. Amen."

On Tuesday, November 7th, 2023, you and I will have an opportunity to take a stand. Tuesday is Election Day, and most American citizens eighteen years of age and older have the constitutional right and privilege to vote for the people they want to serve them in governmental offices. While the framers of the Constitution were strongly influenced by the ideas of John Locke, the English philosopher, with regard to human rights and government, Luther and the Lutheran Confessions had written similarly about the relationship between church and state centuries before. Recognizing that civil government, with all its faults and imperfections, is instituted and ordained by God, Luther and the Confessions encourage Christians to actively and willingly serve their country according to their calling in life by doing everything they could for the common good. Long before "separation between church and state" was an issue, Luther and the Confessions recognized and distinguished between the two institutions and powers. While the church exercises its power in society by preaching the Gospel, forgiving and retaining sins, and distributing the sacraments, the state exercises its power by using and threatening to use physical punishment and penalties to protect human life and the property of its citizens from the power of others. Luther writes that the church and the state are to be held in honor by all people as the highest gifts of God on earth.

With the above thoughts in mind, I will gladly and willingly exercise my right as an American citizen to vote for the candidates of my choice on Tuesday, and I encourage you to do likewise. See you at the polls.

Are we missing something?

While traveling last month we were able to attend another LCMS church and enjoy the worship and message. The Message was beautifully presented . . but a little blunt.

What messages from God are we missing?

•Is God not clear in His message to us about his Son Jesus?

Luke 9:35 And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!"

•Is Jesus unclear about His message to us?

<u>Matthew 28:18-20</u> And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

•What is God asking; you, me, us, about how He would have us serve Him?

Hopefully you have received, completed and returned the <u>Time and Talent Survey</u> sent out in October. It is intended to both Invite and Challenge each one of us to step up and take up our crosses and follow Him. Follow Him not only in worship and fellowship, but also in evangelism, discipleship and in outreach service to others in our community.

I pray we all will prayerfully consider our positions in Life and identify what and how our Christian Lifestyle will be utilized to God's Glory, now and as we await our call to our home in Heaven.

Update from the Board of Directors

The Board of Directors met on October 4th and discussed several items relating to the use of Messiah's facilities.

- We are implementing a \$1,500.00 security deposit for the sports teams that have a contract to use the Family Life Center gym.
- We're looking at installing cameras in the common areas of the gym and the foyer of the FLC.
- The adult fellowship room will be limited to use by Messiah members.
- With regard to our newly refurbished sanctuary, the board voted that the sanctuary will not be used for any purpose other than a religious service, to include weddings and funerals.
- The board further decided that, as the Boy Scouts of America no longer espouse teachings which embrace LCMS values, the Scouts will not be able to use Messiah's facilities.

Other discussion items included:

- Appointment of Margaret Leachman to fill a vacancy on the Preschool Committee.
- The 2024 church budget (which will be presented at a Town Hall on November 5th).
- The possibility of MLC becoming a sponsor of the Hill Country Pregnancy Care Center as part of our missions outreach. (No decision was reached on this issue.)

Update from the Call Committee

The Call Committee met on Tuesday, October 24th and discussed issues related to the anticipated interview process. It was decided that once the pastoral information is reviewed, candidates that we would like to interview will be accomplished through a Zoom meeting. We have agreed that three individuals will ask blanket, predetermined questions pertaining to information focused on Messiah's priorities of youth, community outreach and leadership issues. The three individuals that will be asking questions of the candidates are Sharon Loren, Joe Sorensen and Becca Sagebiel.

District has directed Pastor Mark Barz of Crown of Life Lutheran in San Antonio to assist us in the interview process. By the time you read this, we will have met with Pastor Barz in person (meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 1st). Pastor Barz will also sit in on interviews once they begin.

The Call Committee will finalize the questions to be asked of the candidates with the help of Pastor Barz and will provide those questions to the congregation prior to the Town Hall meeting on the 5th of November. District has suggested

that initial interview questions should be restricted to five or six basic questions. More detailed questions can then be asked during follow-up interviews with candidates selected for further screening. If there are other BASIC questions the congregation feels should be asked during preliminary interviews, the Town Hall forum will be the time to bring up suggestions that can be considered by the Call Committee and Pastor Barz.

As I have indicated in other correspondence, I don't anticipate receiving any information from District until near the end of November as pastors open to a call typically have six weeks to respond to the information given to them by District. Since our completed call package was not sent until the first week of October, it probably did not go out from District until the following week as our package had to be reviewed by District before distribution.

Please continue to pray for our future permanent pastor and for the entire call process and for Messiah. We know this is in God's hands and he will provide in His time, which as we all know is not necessarily our time.

Adult Education

November is a month we give thanks to God for all our blessings - first for His gift of Jesus for forgiveness and our salvation! In the United States we celebrate Thanksgiving Day, November 23rd.

In thankfulness we reflect on the Reformation, which we celebrated as beginning 506 years ago last All Saints Eve, October 31. That is when Luther called for an academic debate on the then current practice of selling Indulgences along with the promise that they, along with prescribed would certain actions, arant forgiveness. This forgiveness was not only for the purchaser, but could be applied to others, even the dead. Luther's position was that Indulgences had no foundation in Scriptures or the Early Church Fathers and therefore were a shame. Forgiveness was received by a repentant person only by grace through faith in Jesus based on Scripture.

Not only academics but common people were awakened to return to Scripture and what the Bible taught about law and gospel. This free forgiveness was great "news", and it came from God. In many ways the spread of the Reformation has mirrored the spread of the Christian Faith since then. Neighbors, friends, co-workers, and family members shared the Good News of salvation by grace through faith in the Only Son of the Father.

Each age had great "thinkers" who shared their insights. The words of the Apostles and Early Church Fathers, along with the words of Martin Luther, Melanchthon,

In whatever vocation Christ has placed you, be it spouse, child, grandparent, neighbor, citizen, worker, employer, butcher, baker, candlestick maker, or whatever, Christ has placed you there to be his ambassador (2 Corinthians 5:20). May we all be thankful and give all glory to God! Amen.

Messiah Lutheran Church in Boerne celebrated a "Re-Dedication" on Sunday, October 8th to celebrate a two-year refurbishment project. Messiah was blessed by very generous benefactor and many additional generous supporters to refurbish the 28-year-old building. The Refurbishment was a dream and desire by a member family to transform the building into a more traditional wood enhanced design. A Houston Architect designed changes that included upgrades to: the Vestibule, Narthex, Restrooms, Welcome Center, Audio Visual booth, Kitchen and Sanctuary.

Generous family donations were made for eleven stained glass windows to compliment the architecturally redesigned wood beams, panels, doors and trim. The beautiful stained-glass windows were designed by a prominent glass artist with an "I AM" theme in ten windows and a beautiful Altar window of the resurrected Christ.

Two of Messiah's previous pastors were invited to conduct the Re-Dedication. Pastor Steve Fick and Pastor Mark Dankis, (Messiah's first pastor) conducted the service. Beautiful acapella music was provided by 120 members of the singing group, Friends in Harmony and Harmony Belles led by Messiah member Artie Dolt. A moving message about the refurbishment project was presented by Mr. Bill Thomas. Members and guests were treated to a reception following the Re-dedication.




