"Lent A Time to Refocus"

Optometrists suggest that people who wear eyeglasses or contacts should have their eyesight checked once a year. Why? Because people's eyesight changes over time. When they have their eyes examined, they may learn that their eyesight hasn't changed. Great! Oftentimes, however, they will learn that their eyesight has changed and that they need new lenses or contacts. Again, great! Now they can refocus their eyesight to see things clearly once again.

Just as people should regularly have their physical eyesight checked, so also they need to have their spiritual eyesight checked regularly. The church has developed special seasons of the year for such check-ups to take place: Advent and Lent. Both Advent and Lent are known as penitential seasons, times for repentance, that is, contrition and sorrow over sins and faith in the grace and forgiveness of God offered to all in Jesus Christ. When we look at ourselves in the mirror of God's law, we see how far short we fall in fulfilling God's will for us, and when we see God's grace and forgiveness offered to us in the person and saving work of Jesus Christ on our behalf, the Holy Spirit works faith in our heart to believe that Jesus is our Lord and Savior. Do you see Jesus clearly as the Son of God and the Savior of the world—your Savior and my Savior—or is it time for you to come in to Messiah and have your spiritual eyesight checked?

If you have been attending our Midweek services, you already know that this Lenten season Messiah Lutheran Church is providing spiritual vision checks by following a sermon series entitled, Honest Repentance. Repentance starts with being honest before God and ourselves about who we are. By using Holy Scripture and Lutheran doctrine, the sermons identify sin as the thing that stifles our humanity while repentance results in our natural impulses functioning more as God designed them. As we come to Messiah to have our spiritual eyesight checked, we will not only see our sins more clearly, but we will also hear about God's enormous love and grace displayed for the whole world to see in the passion, suffering, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Trusting in Christ for the forgiveness of all your sins, God promises that you will come away with 20/20 vision for daily living. See you in church,

From the Board of Elders

Messiah's Transition Teams (Learning Groups)

If you were in church last Sunday, you heard Pastor Lofgren announce that all **five of the Transition Groups** have been formed and will soon go to work on their respective assignments.

As you recall, the Transition Team is comprised of **three learning teams**, **a vision team** and **a mission statement team**.



The three Learning Teams are as follows:

- (1) Community Partnerships and community involvement. Messiah currently has working relationships with the Hill Country Pregnancy Center and the Hill Country Daily Bread Ministries, along with sponsoring a cub scout pack and probably others of which I am not aware. This group will determine how well we are doing in support of those ministries and what other ministries are in the Boerne community that warrant our involvement and could have an impact in spreading God's word.
- (2) Culture. What is the culture and demographics of the Boerne community? How do the demographics of Messiah compare to the community at large and how do we leverage of our similarities and alter our differences in order to draw more people to the church? (I'm talking ethnic, age, language, etc. not doctrinal issues).
- (3) Leadership structure. The last group will look at how the leadership of the church is set up and determine whether changes are warranted. We currently have a two board system with Lay Ministers addressing the ministries of the church and a Board of Directors that oversees the business dealings of the church. There was a committee that put in many hours in updating the existing constitution, which has been in place since 2011, and was recently finalized between the church and the district. It may be as simple as affirming the new constitution, or the group may determine that the church should return to a simpler set of by-laws with a single board of directors consisting of officers of the congregation and the elected Lay Ministers.

Once these three groups have completed their tasks, they will give that information to the <u>Vision Team</u>, which will use that information to formulate a vision for Messiah's future. Once the team has determined it's vision for Messiah, that vision will be presented to the voters, probably first, in a workshop format to get member input and then after finalized, to the voters for formal approval by the voting members. Once approved by the voters, <u>the vision team will hand the vision to the Mission Statement Team</u>, who will come up with a Mission Statement that reflects the vision of the church.

As to the timing of this effort, the three Learning Teams will be asked to complete their respective assignments within 60 days, around the end of April. It is hoped that the Vision Team can complete its work in the ensuing 30 days and then have the two mentioned meetings within 30 days of completing their initial proposal. When voter approval is received, it is hoped that the Mission Statement team will be able to come up with the mission statement within a 30 day period as well. If this schedule were accomplished, Messiah would have a Vision and Mission Statement by the end of July and would be prepared to provide that information for a call document.

Pastor Lofgren is providing the names and numbers of the members of each of the teams in Friday's newsletter. If you have thoughts or can provide information that might be useful to any of the teams, please contact someone on that team. Even though each team consists of just five members, this is a church wide effort. I know that many of you are very anxious to get on with calling a permanent pastor, so the more quickly this process can be completed, the quicker we can get to the point of being ready to call our next pastor. **Your brother in Christ, Mike Lang**

The Refurbishment project continues with some minor setbacks due to weather and fire marshal approvals. Key progress has been made with completing the installation of the water line for the required fire sprinkler system. The sprinkler plan has been submitted and awaiting fire marshal review and approval before installation can begin. This component of the project has been one of the most delayed from what was originally planned.

The new windows are being replaced. They look great and are energy efficient. Nine(9) of the ten (10) stained glass windows have been purchased by generous members. The New Altar window frame for the stained glass has arrived. The installation has been delayed due to a need to have engineering approved for assuring the structure will support the weight of the exterior stone work.



Both the restrooms have been completed, including an additional commode in the lady's restroom. We are awaiting the new ADA sinks and cabinets. The new Coffee Bar Kitchen has been plumbed and wired for a new commercial coffee maker that has been generously donated. It will be like the one in the Family Life Center. The lighting and electrical applications for the Narthex and Sanctuary have been completed and approved by inspection of the fire marshal. Sheetrocking the walls can now be finished. The flooring is waiting to be installed once overhead work can be completed in order to protect it. The sound booth has been rewired and is ready to sheetrock.

While some delays were anticipated, we continue to pray that progress can be made as quickly as possible and we can celebrate in the sanctuary and enjoy an updated bright and beautiful Narthex soon.

Galatians 1:6-8 Perversion of the Gospel - 6 I am amazed that you are so quickly deserting Him who called you by the grace of Christ, for a different gospel; 7 which is really not another; only there are some who are disturbing you and want to distort the gospel of Christ. 8 But even if we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to what we have preached to you, he is to be accursed! NASB

Adult Education

The Galatians had been brought to the true Christian faith by Paul, from the law to the gospel, during his first missionary journey. After his departure, however, false teachers came along. They were disciples of the true apostles, but they so turned the Galatians around that they believed they had to be saved by works of the law. The Scripture above was Paul's response to his flock in Galatia. Paul wrote these words in 50 AD, and Satan has been using false teachers ever since.

Today we have some who have been raised in the Christian faith but who are distorting the true Gospel. I have firsthand experience with such teachers in universities influencing our family members. Friends report their children and grandchildren are "losing their faith". The lies are 2000 years old but come in new packages. False teachers, "Progressive Christians", teach "Critical Theory" with a new interpretation of scripture. They raise doubts about the virgin birth of Christ, about His resurrection, and recently have brought doubt on the Penal Substitutionary Atonement (PSA) of Christ for our sins!

Lutherans and Bible believing Christians confess Jesus died on the cross as the substitute for sinners. Christ's death is penal because he paid the penalty for our sins. The description of Messiah in Isaiah 53:4–6 says His suffering is meant to heal our wounds. The fact that the Messiah was to be "crushed for our iniquities" (verse 5) is a direct reference to penal substitution. Jesus claims to be the "good shepherd" who lays down His life for the sheep in John 10:10. Paul, in Romans 3:25–26, says we have the righteousness of Christ because of His sacrifice.

Yet "Progressive Christians" teach that God is love and he would never require His Son to be killed as a substitute for humans. They say teaching PSA is at the root of child abuse and other crimes against humanity. Some even declare such teaching about the atonement of Christ is at the heart of race hatred and war crimes.

How do we respond in love? We must follow Christ and Paul's example, and make sure we know how to share the truth as evangelists and apologists. In March **Pastor Lofgren** will continue teaching the basics of Bible doctrine at 9:15 AM on Sunday's. **Mark Giardinelli** and I will begin teaching about how to deal with Progressive Christians from Alicia Childers book "Another Gospel?". We will look at the Lutheran Difference in LCMS vs. other synods, and **David Wendeborn** will be teaching on the role of discipleship. **Ladies Bible study** at 10 AM Friday mornings will begin with a new minor prophet. Join us. **Dennis Parker**




