

"You meant it for evil - but meant if for Good"

Jesus says, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." This is the well-known Golden Rule, updated as, "Treat others the way you would like to be treated." That seems simple enough. I think I can be kind, friendly, and nice to the people I meet, just as I would like other people to be kind, friendly, and nice to me.

But it doesn't always work out that way, does it? Sometimes due to our sinful nature and the circumstances of life, rather than treating people the way we would like to be treated, we mistreat them, misuse them, or even abuse them. Sometimes we are corrected for our bad behavior right away, and when we are, we ought to confess our sin against our neighbor and change our sinful behavior, in other words, repent. But at other times, we seemingly get away with it, and only later are we confronted with the wrong we did.

This is what happened to Joseph's brothers after they sold their brother Joseph into slavery in Egypt. Only after traveling to Egypt because of their need for food due to famine in the land of Israel were they confronted with their sin. Joseph was alive, and not only was he alive, he was second-in-command in Egypt. The brothers were confronted by their sin, afraid for their lives, and in despair.

Aware of his brothers' sorrow over their sin, Joseph spoke to them the following words of grace: "As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good" (Genesis 50:20). God is in charge of everything that happens in life, sometimes allowing evil to take place for His future mission of grace. In Joseph's case, God allowed him to be sold into slavery in order that he might prepare for the famine in the land and many lives might be saved. In the brothers' case, God allowed them to sell Joseph into slavery so that years later they might be saved through his wise and faithful stewardship of the crops in Egypt for their welfare.

During the month of March, we have special opportunities to celebrate God's grace in the lives of His people. On *Sunday, March 17th, we will remember St. Patrick in our worship service*. He was captured as a teenager by raiders and sold into slavery in Ireland, but after escaping and becoming a bishop in France, he returned to Ireland to spread the Gospel and save many unbelievers. And, of course, *we will celebrate the greatest example of God using evil for good on Easter Sunday, March 31st*, when we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. He was crucified for sinners, but rose again to give life and immortality to everyone who believes in Him.

A big part of the month was involved with moving, the first part of the month we moved



Update from Call Committee

If you were in church Sunday, you already know which way the Call Committee is headed. As of Sunday, the committee was going to re-review the original PIFs and SETs provided on the twelve pastors that we originally received from District. District specifically wanted the committee to look at the pastors that were over the age of 60 as they thought there might be a fit for Messiah with one of those pastors whose ministry horizon might still be 10 or 15 years. It was felt that if a more senior pastor was called and could move the church forward, in 5 or 6 years, an assistant pastor could be called that might then take the baton from the senior pastor when he did decide to retire. As it turned out, one of the pastors had just taken a call and was installed at his new church in January and a second had decided he was no longer open to a call and asked District to remove him from all call lists. Sounded like he had decided to remain at his current congregation for the remainder of his ministry. The third pastor appears to be available, so we will give him another look.

The second thing you would have heard is that even though the committee was looking back over the original information, we had requested a second set of candidates from District. I did receive an acknowledgement from President Newman of the receipt of the request and was informed that his support staff would get one to us as soon as possible. When we receive the new names, we will go through the same process of reading each pastor's information and trying to identify two or three (or more) that we feel could best serve Messiah. Once identified, they will be contacted to determine whether they are open to a call from Messiah. Those that are, we'll have conversations with them and from there, come up with names to again, present to the congregation.

Please keep everyone involved in this process in your prayers. I know the congregation is eager to find a permanent pastor, but I ask for your patience. God will deliver the right pastor in His time.

February was a busy month at Messiah's Kids. We celebrated rodeo week with pony rides, a petting zoo and breakfast tacos.


Pastor Lofgren joined us on Ash Wednesday where he blessed our friends with ashes. February was over in the blink of an eye.
