Like Clockwork . . .

It's like clockwork. When we lived in Indiana, we bought a forsythia bush for the parsonage yard. The first year I noticed that the first blooms were on its branches as we left for a spring break vacation on March 31st. The same thing occurred the next year, and once again the following year. Buds were on the branches of our forsythia bush, ready to burst into bloom by the first of April. So it was with many of the flowers in our yard: the crocuses, the daffodils, and the tulips. God is faithful, as he promises in his Word:

While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease (Gen 8:22).

God is in control of all things in the universe he created, and like clockwork, the beauty of spring is here!

God's faithfulness is clearly visible in his creation, but his ultimate manifestation of faithfulness is seen in the physical resurrection of his Son, Jesus Christ, from the grave. In the Old and New Testaments God slowly reveals his plan of salvation. For example, the third day gains a special significance in the Scriptures. The prophet Hosea promises that God's repentant people would not only be punished because of their sins but also healed and raised up on the third day (6:2). In the book of Jonah, the great fish spits out the repentant prophet upon dry land on the third day (2:10; Cf. Mt 16:4). In speaking to some Pharisees about his ministry, Jesus tells them that he would "cast out demons and perform cures today and tomorrow, and the third day I finish my course" (Lk 13:32). It is little wonder, then, that, like clockwork, God's greatest miracle occurred when Jesus rose from the grave on the third day (Mt 16:21; 17:23; 20:19).

In the church year there are three days of special significance at the end of Holy Week, known as the Triduum: from dusk on Maundy Thursday to dusk on Good Friday, from dusk of Good Friday to dusk of Holy Saturday, and from dusk of Holy Saturday to dusk of Easter Sunday. At our communion service on Maundy Thursday evening at 6:30 p.m., we will remember the Institution of the Lord's Supper. On Good Friday at 6:30 p.m. we will commemorate the Death of our Lord. Then, at our communion services at 7:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Easter Sunday, we will celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord.

You see, it is like clockwork: He is risen! He is risen, indeed!

From the Board of Elders



Questions have arisen concerning how to get prayer requests to the church. This issue was discussed between Pastor Lofgren, Laura Sanders, Dennis Parker, and me. At this time, it has been decided that there should be three avenues of getting prayer needs met depending on the severity for the need for the prayers.

In the event of a life-threatening emergency, where immediate prayers and pastoral support may be needed, Pastor Lofgren should be contacted directly by phone call or text. His mobile number is 260-417-9003. He is available at any time, day, or night. If such an emergency should arise and Pastor Lofgren cannot be reached, call or text your elder, again, regardless of time of day or night.

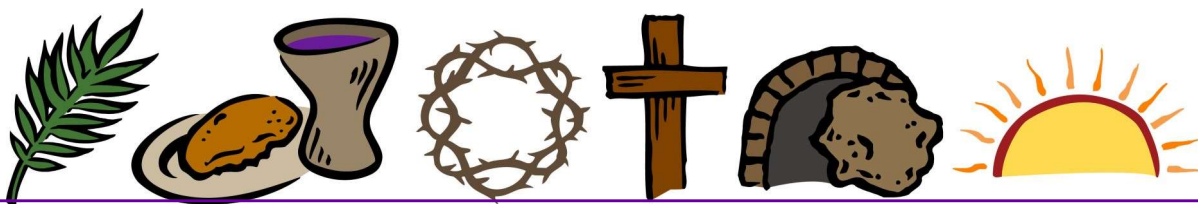
For issues needing immediate prayers, but are not life-threatening, contact your elder at the earliest appropriate time of day (most people use the 9:00 am to 9:00 pm rule). For other prayer requests that are not 'immediate' (prayers for a child to find employment), you may submit a prayer request through the website, and it will get to the church office and your elder will be notified as well.

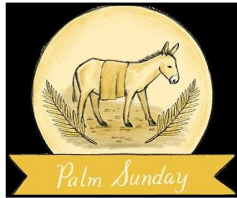
In each of these circumstances you may determine how private or public the prayer need should be. The website has options available and if you contact Pastor Lofgren or your elder, you can let them know your desire for who all should pray about the issue. Please do not send prayer requests to the 210 number that was used during Covid, as that number is no longer being monitored.

On another issue, the learning groups are working on their assignments and trying to get the information needed by the Vision and Mission Statement teams in order to complete some of the information that will be needed to begin the process of calling a permanent pastor. In addition to the information they will produce, the district also requires that each member of the congregation complete a 'Pastoral Profile Survey.' The survey is only 15 questions and will take perhaps 10 – 15 minutes to complete. The district website indicates that the survey can be completed on Survey Monkey, but I will speak with our district support person to determine the best way to provide the surveys to the district.

You should receive either a link for completing the survey or a pdf copy of the survey from your elder sometime after Easter. We have plenty of time, but I did not want the learning teams to complete their work and then have to wait on our members to complete these surveys before we could begin the call process. I'll let you know when they are coming so you can look for them.

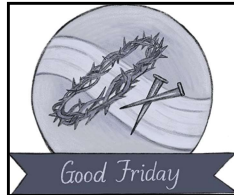




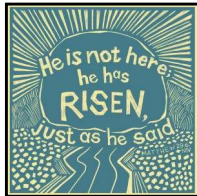

Messiah Refurbishment Update . . .

The Refurbishment project is moving forward, delayed, but moving. The walls have been completed with sheet rock. All of the windows have been replaced. The new front altar window has been installed. The stained glass windows have been graciously purchased by generous members. New front doors have been ordered. The required fire sprinkler & fire alarm system has been installed and awaiting fire marshal approval. Once the fire marshal has approved the system, the ceilings can be installed. The millwork has been constructed and is awaiting installation. Both restrooms have been completed. The kitchen coffee bar has been completed, and a new commercial coffee maker has been generously purchased. The sound booth has been completed. The electronics have been repositioned in the new AV storage room. The flooring has been selected and will be installed once the overhead work is completed. The pews have been ordered and await installation as one of the last steps in the project. We are planning a grand opening to share the church with the community the date still to be determined.

Messiah's Adult Education

Adult Education Lay Ministry's purpose is to disciple and continuously catechize our existing members so that we may grow in faith, biblical knowledge, and our ability to share the Gospel and defend our faith. We do this by establishing small groups for Bible study and classes on how we should live as Christians. Also, Messiah provides subscriptions to Lutheran Witness Magazine and Portals of Prayer for daily devotionals and Scripture readings.



We began 2023 encouraging members to read through the Bible in a year using a chronological daily reading plan that mixes weekday readings in the Old Testament with weekend readings in the New Testament. We are using Laura Sanders' new book, *Your Daily Companion to the Bible*, available on Amazon as a softback or in digital format on Kindle. It links daily readings with short meaningful information, reflection, and explanation to help you get the most out of each reading. We start week 14 on Monday April 3, with Deuteronomy 4-6. We learn from where our wisdom and understanding come in Deut. 4, review the Ten Commandments in Deut. 5, and how and what to teach our children in Deut. 6. For those wanting to share and discuss Laura has established an online "Pumble" account and we are available for small groups for periodic discussions.

Pastor Lofgren's Sunday morning 9:15 am Bible class is studying "What We Believe, Teach and Confess", the Scriptural basis of our Lutheran doctrines. In April he is reviewing Chapter 6, "God the Son and Redemption." Join us each Sunday after fellowship for this enlightening hour and bring your questions.

A Ladies small group meets on Fridays from 10:00 through 11:30 in the Family Life Center classroom. They started a new six-week study March 24 of the minor prophet Haggai led by Kathlin Juaregui. They are using a book and videos entitled "Take Courage" by Jennifer Rothschild. All ladies are welcome to join them. (This group will not meet Good Friday, April 7.)

Our Bible Study and Lunch group meets each Sunday after Worship at 11:45 AM in the Family Life Center classroom for an hour and then goes for lunch afterward. Everyone is welcome. In April Dennis and Mark are leading a study about the Postmodern Progressive Church movement, concerns many are deconstructing their faith, and how the Bible teaches us to respond and witness in this new age. We are using several resources including Alisa Childers book "Another Gospel" and videos. All are welcome to join us. (This group will not meet on Easter Sunday, April 9.) *Dennis Parker*

News from Messiah's Kids Preschool Committee

We are excited to share that Messiah's Kids Preschool is the recipient of the Child Care Relief Fund Grant through the Texas Workforce Commission. While these sorts of funds are not typically available to parochial centers, we are beyond blessed to be awarded this grant. The main goal of this grant is to recruit and retain staff, provide affordable childcare to area families, and equip the facility with needed upgrades and maintenance. This money is in a restricted account to meet the needs of Messiah's Kids Preschool to ensure it continues to be a high performing early childhood center.

Thus far, funds have been used to:

- ◆ Retain staff
- ◆ Assist multiple families with tuition costs
- ◆ Replace the AED in the Family Life Center
- ◆ Repair the air conditioner in the Family Life Center



Further plans for the funds include:

- ◆ Security upgrades
- ◆ Playground upgrades
- ◆ Finishing out the parking circle at the Family Life Center
- ◆ Fellowship room carpet replacement
- ◆ Painting

The Preschool Committee would like to thank Anthony Sansone for providing assistance to Gina during the grant application process. We are grateful for Gina's initiative and forward-looking effort to secure this extremely beneficial grant. It is our hope that all will see the use of this money in the upkeep of the Family Life Center and the continued excitement around the children and families who we continue to serve in the name of Jesus.

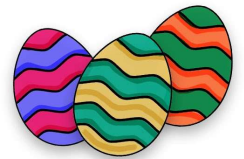
