Refurbished

As we look forward to returning to worship in our newly refurbished church -

do we as members need refurbishment as well?

Boerne continues to grow, not everyone thinks that is a good thing. We are faced with many challenges with that growth. Our surrounding neighborhoods are changing, growing. We have heard it said; "Change is inevitable, Growth is optional." Messiah has voiced a desire to grow, both up and out. As our community grows, we have the opportunity to put into action our calling:

Matthew 28:18 And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Our growth as Christians is an ongoing refurbishment process, starting with baptism, growing with teaching, strengthened by Christ's Body and Blood, supplemented with prayer, fellowshipping with other believers until we reach our ultimate home with our teacher Jesus in heaven.

Like us, many in our neighborhoods need the refurbishment of knowing Jesus. Our challenge to "Go and make disciples, baptizing and teaching" is a tough one. If we are to grow, we must be willing to speak the truth in love.

Ephesians 4:15-16 "Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into

him who is the head, into Christ, 16 from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love."

A reminder of the challenge to grow by speaking the truth in love came from the July 30th Portals of Prayer message:

"... a mature faith is anchored to Christ. The text says that we grow by "speaking the truth in love" (Eph 4:15). That may sound simple, but it can be hard to put into practice. It is easy to value the truth so much that we speak it harshly, losing sight of the precious gift that is our neighbor. It is easy to value love so much that we are willing to ignore the truth in an attempt to care. Yet Paul here urges us toward both truth and love. Giving both is possible When speaking the truth, let's and good. remember also to love. In our desire to love, let's make sure we are also speaking the truth. Without truth, it's not really love; and without love, it's not the full truth . . . Anchored to Jesus, we, too can speak the truth in love to those who need Jesus."

We will very soon have a fresh new refurbished church building! We are faced with the ongoing challenge of reaching out to our neighbors and friends in truth and love to bring the knowledge of Jesus to them. May each of us seek to be refurbished in our desire to take on the challenge of making disciples using the gifts each of us has been given as we, "Go, make, baptize and teach."

From you Elder and Call Committee . . .

Brothers and Sisters in Christ: I want to keep you up to date on the progress being made on the call for a permanent pastor. As you know, the call committee has been in place for several weeks and again, consists of Debra Beard, Rebecca Bottlinger, Sharon Loren, Kim Maloy, Rebecca Sagebiel, Brad Sanders, Joe Sorenson, Sue Theis and me. The committee had a Zoom meeting with our District representative, Larry Reitz on Thursday, the 27th in which Larry brought us up to speed on the call process and the timing of the steps to be taken.

In last Friday's weekly newsletter, I encouraged you to begin completing your Pastoral Profile Surveys online via the link you should have received from Maurine in the first week of August. I asked that you try to get your surveys in within two weeks of receiving the link, but I realize there is a lot going on in August, with families trying to get in last minute vacations as well as school starting in mid to late August. Just to let you know, the survey will stay open until the end of August, so you have four weeks to get your survey uploaded. I encourage you to add comments to each of your responses, since your comments shed light on why you answered a question as you did. The surveys are kept confidential, so your comments will remain with District. The congregation will receive a report reflecting our responses to the questions in the form of graphs and tables, but our comments will not be included in the report in any way.

The Learning Teams are nearing completion of their task as the Mission Statement Team is now working on a Mission Statement for Messiah. The other portion of Messiah's 'Self Evaluation' as I have told you before, is nearing completion with input concerning the historical demographics and financial position of Messiah being compiled by Maurine, Anthony Sansone, our Treasurer, and me. We will begin formulating the information into its proper form for submission as part of the Call Package to be sent to District.

As a reminder, if any member would like to submit the name of a pastor for consideration in our Call Package, they should complete a 'Nomination Form for Pastoral Call List'. Copies of the form have been on the information table each Sunday and will be there throughout August. An announcement will be made a week or so before the nomination period is closed, as well as a reminder for the closing of the pastoral survey. Please keep in mind that pastors nominated from the congregation may not come back to Messiah as feasible candidates for whatever reason(s) as determined by District.

My hope is that our complete Call Package will be finalized and ready for submission to District in early September. If that could be accomplished, District might be able to review the package and submit it to pastors who are open to a call within a week or so of receiving it. Any pastor open to considering a call to Messiah would have approximately six weeks to return their personal information to District. District would review the information it receives from the pastors and would then send us the list of pastors. By this time-table, in the best of cases, we could have candidates for the call committee to begin screening by late October or early November.

Please continue to pray for Messiah and the entire call process, keeping in mind that God has already selected our next pastor. Our prayers should be that His will be done.

Building a Discipling Culture

One of the books I have read recently is entitled Building a Discipling Culture, written by Mike Breem and other members of his ministry team. The goal of the book is to provide a strategy for teaching people how to make disciples the way Jesus did in order to send them out into the community to continue the process of making disciples among the people they meet. The strategy involves using three types or methods of learning: Classroom/Lecture on of information), (passing Apprenticeship (practical application of the information), and Immersion (experiential learning of information in a real life setting). Most educators agree that learning takes place best when all three of these types of learning take place at the same time, such as when learning a foreign language (classroom, tutor, foreign exchange).

Most churches teach the Christian faith by using the classroom/lecture methodology, for example, sermons, Bible and Sunday School classes, confirmation classes, and small groups. This is a great way to pass on information from one generation to another. We all understand this since we've all experienced this. Doctors and plumbers also have classroom hours, listen to lectures, and read books, but that's not all. Who would want a doctor performing surgery or a plumber fixing your pipes if all they had was book knowledge?

This is where apprenticeship comes in—learning how to apply the knowledge learned in the classroom in a practical situation. This is why many professions have an apprenticeship program as part of their process for employment. In fact, while serving as the pastor of a previous congregation, I had the opportunity to work in the vicarage program, DCE internship, and fieldwork education apprenticeships of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. In real life, when we want to learn how to do something, we often find someone to teach us how to do it. Someone invests their time, energy, skills, and life into ours, teaching us to do what they do.

Immersion, the third type of learning, is the most subtle type because it's where our personalities and learning environments come together to shape us into the people we are becoming. In immersion a group of people who are competent in their craft or



skill are gathered together, and people in the process of learning then learn the skill by observation and practice within the culture. The key to learning by immersion is having access to the culture you are hoping to shape you. Unfortunately, the church as we know it today is mostly about the first kind of learning, classroom/lecture, and churches in which the process of disciples making disciples is the cultural norm are rare.

Don't you agree that an important goal for Messiah Lutheran Church is to become a culture where the process of disciples making disciples is the norm? After all, that's what Jesus wants, isn't it (Mt. 28:19-Breem writes: "Discipleship isn't a random assortment of facts and propositions and behaviors. Discipleship is something that is you to the core and is completely incarnated in you. If it is information, it is information that has worked its way into you and is now part of you," similar to the way that Jesus made the first disciples. By our regular schedule of worship services, classroom activities, fellowship activities, board and committee meetings, and serving in our various vocations in the community, we are involved in the process of building Messiah Lutheran Church into a discipling culture.

Turn Your Problems Over to God . . .

How many times have you faced serious difficulties and a Christian friend says, "just turn it over to God"?

Some may say "just pray about it" and remember the Words of Jesus, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me." (John 14:1)

When you have a seriously ill loved one or a dire job situation such words may not be encouraging. Our human heart and mind can't help worrying, thinking, and drumming up all the bad things that might happen. We become anxious, paralyzed, or frantic about the bad things that ARE happening.

As baptized, forgiven sinners we are children of God, we believe yet we have doubts. Recall Jesus challenging the man who asked him to heal his child "if He (Jesus) can," Mark 9:23-24 "And Jesus said, "If you can! All things are possible for one who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!".

Of course, we believe Jesus loves us and cares for us, but we still have a problem with accepting God's will in our lives. Truly Jesus promised, "Come to me you who are weary and heavy laden, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28) He also said, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me." (John 14:1)

Jesus says to trust and to be active, not passive. He asks us to be strong and courageous. Recall His words to the disciples caught in the storm? "Why were you afraid? Why were you afraid when I was with you?" (Matthew 8:23-27)

Indeed, why are we so afraid when He is with us? Because we still have fears and worries as earthly people – like Mary and Martha. Death stings now even though we know believers will be resurrected.

God always answers prayers, but not always as we want. According to Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 12:1-10, he asked God three times to remove this "thorn" in the flesh, but God refused. The Bible is clear that God's grace was sufficient for him and that he was able to find strength in his weakness.

Recall what Jesus Himself faced, And taking with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, he began to be sorrowful and troubled. Then he said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with me."

Jesus "turned it over to God," "And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will." (Matt 26:37-39).

God, we believe, help us be strong as your will is done! Amen.




Edward Adrian Funk



How HCPCC Helps:

- 22 babies have been born to our clients so far in 2023. These parents receive one-on-one education and support, plus essential baby items like clothing, diapers, and car seats.

You may think this is only for the "elderly"; however, you would be surprised to learn that individuals in the 18 - 24 age range were more than three times more likely to fail to recognize scams. Other studies report that millennials are 77% more likely than other age groups to say they lost money to a scam that started with an email. Could you help us get the word out? The younger generation can always use Medicare information to help their parents or grandparents understand the complexities.
